## 3. Terminology and Conventions

### 3.1 Conventions

### 3.2 Definitions

**Enabler Release** Collection of specifications that combined together form an enabler for a service area, e.g. a download enabler, a browsing enabler, a messaging enabler, a location enabler, etc. The specifications that are forming an enabler should combined fulfil a number of related market requirements.

**Minimum Functionality Description** Description of the guaranteed features and functionality that will be enabled by implementing the minimum mandatory part of the Enabler Release.

## 4. Release Version Overview

This document outlines the Enabler Release Definition for the Charging Enabler and the respective conformance requirements for clients and servers claiming compliance to it as defined by Open Mobile Alliance across the specification baseline.

The motivation for the creation of a Charging Enabler was established in the Work Item outlining the effort. The ability to charge for service usage is fundamental when creating services using OMA enablers.

### 4.1 Version 1.0 Functionality

The first version of the Enabler Release specifies the OMA Charging interfaces and a protocol binding to Diameter Applications.

### 4.2 Version 1.1 Functionality

The new version of the Enabler Release specifies how the OMA CH-2 interface MAY be exposed as a Web Service, which is compliant with the Parlay X Web Services Payment API.

The current version also includes technical refinements and changes to the maintenance of OMA Charging Data Elements.
